Our work to empower young people and strengthen local communities became more critical than ever in 2020-2021, as the pandemic exposed even greater inequalities. We believe that by working together, a more inclusive and sustainable society is possible and young people are ready to lead this transition.

To better understand the views and expectations of the next generation, we launched The Davos Lab Initiative to help inform and shape the post-pandemic era. Global Shapers organized Davos Lab dialogues in 146 cities on the ten key issues they identified as being most urgent. The dialogues reached an audience of more than 2 million people and generated 40 policy recommendations to end injustice and build a better society.

To support our leaders worldwide, we also hosted virtual training, webinars and meetings to offer relevant expertise to our members and connect young people to share best practices. This included a Responsible Leadership Challenge, developed with Accenture, to build the skills and capabilities youth require to lead responsibly amidst the unprecedented global challenges they now face.

Global Shapers also connected with experts at World Economic Forum meetings and through a virtual Meet the Leader series. In conversations with Christine Lagarde, Jane Goodall, Peter Brabeck-Letmathe, Fabiola Gianotti and Mark Carney, members advocated for greater transparency and trust between generations.

It is fitting that this important work coincided with our 10th anniversary. Founded in 2011, the Global Shapers Community now spans more than 14,000 members driving dialogue, action and change in 448 hubs in 150 countries and territories. Thus, the 2020-2021 period marked a year of great celebration and impact.

At the local level, Global Shapers implemented a total of 698 projects this year. Projects included efforts to advance climate action, respond to disasters, restore nature, expand digital access, safeguard mental health and battle the COVID-19 pandemic.

These are the stories of impact and progress that you will read in this report. They are made possible by our remarkable members, donors and collaborators around the world. Thank you for helping us to shine a spotlight on the power and action of young people. This is at the heart of the Global Shapers Community.

Mission

We believe in a world in which young people are central to solution-building, policy-making and lasting change.

Our mission is to inspire, empower and connect young leaders to strengthen their communities and change the world. We do this with significant support from the World Economic Forum.

Founded by Klaus Schwab in 2011, the Global Shapers Community is a network of inspiring young people driving dialogue, action and change.









With the largest youth population in history, there is an unprecedented opportunity for young people to take an active role in shaping the future. This generation has inherited enormous global challenges, but has the ability to confront the status quo and offer youth-led solutions for positive change.

Created ten years ago, the Global Shapers Community is a network of 14,000 inspiring young people driving dialogue, action and change in 448 city-based hubs all around the world – from Atlanta to Accra, and from to Zurich and Zagreb.

In each city, teams of Global Shapers self-organize to create projects that address the needs of their community. Projects are wide-ranging including responding to disasters, combating poverty, fighting climate change and building inclusive communities. Shapers are diverse in expertise, education, income and nationality, but are united by their desire to bring about positive change.

On a global scale, Global Shapers join forces across hubs. They are connected through technology, training, events and joint projects, which enable members to share best practices, grow their skills and extend their impact. Exposure to the World Economic Forum and its network of experts and leaders helps our members to expand their influence and desire to take action.

The Global Shapers Community is a scalable solution for organizing and mobilizing the full potential of young people. It is a non-profit organization registered in Geneva, Switzerland.

Reach

Our reach continues to grow. In 2020-2021, our community increased to over 14,000 Shapers and alumni in 448 hubs.

Since July 2020, we opened 36 hubs and reached four new countries, including Algeria, Kuwait, Gambia and Lichtenstein, expanding our reach to more than 150 countries and territories.

Achieving health equity

COVID-19 has put a spotlight on the growing disparities in communities and has increased the need for coordinated action.

This year, Global Shapers worked to address the social determinants of health, reduce disparities in COVID-19 outcomes, build healthier communities and promote health equity in our global systems.

Many stories of inspiration and action emerged as a result of the COVID-19 crisis as young people connected each other and vulnerable groups to provide support, supplies and services.

For example, Copenhagen Hub led a powerful collaboration across twelve European cities to combat misinformation about the pandemic and the COVID-19 vaccine. Their work was recognized by the World Health Organization's Office in Europe.

Across Africa, Global Shapers accelerated mask wearing to slow the spread of COVID-19. Hubs worked with the World Economic Forum's COVID Action Platform, Africa CDC and the African Union Office of the Youth Envoy to scale #AfricaMaskWeek – a campaign that reached more than 300 million in 100 countries.

Sacramento Hub launched a volunteer corps, which supported 2,000 vulnerable people with essential services. In more than ten hubs, from Belo Horizonte to Bratislava to Detroit and Paris, Shapers created alike platforms to assist local efforts for at-risk groups.

Karachi Hub distributed monthly food rations to 13,000 families, as well as personal protective equipment, face shields, hand sanitisers and masks among front-line health workers in some of the poorest areas of Pakistan. Bill Gates described the hub's heroic efforts as "the best of humanity at a time of crisis".

Similarly, Gaza Hub distributed monthly food rations to 500 families in Palestine – and Manaus Hub reached 100 families in Brazil with support, including 1,300 people temporarily living in youth shelters, refugee camps and indigenous hospitals.

In Venezuela, Global Shapers were announced as official partners of the United Nation's 2020 **Humanitarian Response Plan**, which recognized the efforts of seventeen hubs to save lives, protect well-being and combat the pandemic's effects in the country.

Our members also pushed for adequate mental healthcare for youth, essential workers and their families – and took action to fill existing gaps. In Singapore, Global Shapers worked with the National Youth Council and Youth Corps to facilitate connections between nearly 300 students and mental health professionals.

New Delhi Hub worked with members of our sister community, the Forum of Young Global Leaders, to deliver virtual content on helping yourself, others, your organization and your community manage stress during the pandemic, which had 1,500 views.

Moreover, the Global Shapers **Equity and Inclusion Steering Committee** created a psychological first aid course to equip youth with the skills to provide psychological support through active listening, grounding techniques and links to professional services.

Finally, Global Shapers delivered the **#ShapingDisability** Summit and online activities on the occasion of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities to ensure that no one is left behind in the current pandemic response, as well as in a post-COVID-19 world.

These inspiring impact stories were made possible by the hard work and determination of the Global Shapers COVID-19 Steering Committee and Equity and Inclusion Steering Committee, along with hundreds of motivated Global Shapers around the world.

Off there's ever been a time that we need heroes, it's now. The COVID-19 pandemic has created unprecedented health and economic challenges, especially for the most vulnerable among us. Protecting the planet and nature

A new generation is focused on halting the climate crisis. This year, Global Shapers called for an urgent green recovery plan.

Through joint projects and campaigns, our members pushed for carbon neutrality, made communities more resilient, protected biodiversity and advanced circular economy innovations worldwide.

The Climate Reality training and project incubator have been invaluable catalysts for climate change activism. Climate Reality helped us design a water conservation project that prioritizes equity and environmental justice. Their extra support helped bring more Global Shapers onboard and mobilize others to protect the planet and conserve nature.

In partnership with philanthropist Rosamund Zander and The Climate Reality Project, 350 Global Shapers attended Climate Reality Leadership Corps trainings with Al Gore and his team of global experts and scientists this year. In total, 700 Global Shapers have been trained to lead climate action since 2018.

From May to June 2021, more than 100 Global Shapers also participated in The Climate Reality Project Incubator. They joined virtual sessions to design projects, identify partners and accelerate implementation, which resulted in twenty new projects.

As part of this effort, Sacramento Hub will distribute 1,000 water conservation kits to help combat drought. Morelia Hub will seed a new social enterprise to transform waste into public goods locally. Ho Hub will advance an alternative to coal made from coconut husks and Auckland Hub will integrate Māori solutions into the city's strategy to reach net-zero emissions by 2050.

This year, Global Shapers also supported the World Economic Forum's 1t.org initiative to conserve, restore and grow one trillion trees. Around the world, our members implemented projects to restore healthy forests, agricultural land and coastal ecosystems.

For example, Abuja Hub planted 5,000 trees between April and October 2020. Each tree was entrusted to a local child to encourage environmental stewardship within the next generation.

"Tree-planting projects provide Global Shapers with the ideal opportunity to help mitigate the impacts of climate change that are making future pandemics more likely," shared Jake Okechukwu Effoduh and Abdullahi Murtala, Abuja Hub.

Our members also advanced local circular economy innovation to eliminate waste and conserve our world's resources. 14 hubs are implementing the World Economic Forum's Scale360° Circular Innovation Playbook in their cities, applying circular design principles to business, government and society.

Bangkok Hub helped consumers choose businesses using alternatives to single-use plastics. Mexico City Hub trained government officials in circular design, services and operations. Brussels Hub main-streamed accessible solutions for circular lifestyles and Turin Hub founded a local stakeholder circular innovation alliance to advance critical climate goals.

"It's powerful to see how the Scale360° methodology has spread so rapidly and empowered Global Shapers to become circular innovation leaders in their communities. Now in fourteen cities, Circular Shapers is one of the largest cross-hub collaborations in the Global Shapers Community," said Katie Hoeflinger, Specialist, Climate and Environment, World Economic Forum.

Finally, Global Shapers called for urgent action on Earth Day. Members showcased their solutions to address the climate crisis and encouraged all stakeholders - individuals, communities, businesses, politicians and world leaders - to take action to achieve the targets set out by the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Paris Agreement.

Global Shapers know that only by meeting these goals and staying within our planetary boundaries can we create the sustainable, inclusive and resilient future that we want.

A special thanks goes to the Global Shapers Climate and Environment Steering Committee and Regional Allies who brought these stories of sustainability, hope and human resilience to life.

Shaping the postpandemic era

The idea that we need to rebuild differently after COVID-19 is widely shared. The window for action is open and Shapers responded.

In 2021, we launched the Davos Lab initiative – a multistakeholder approach to better understand the changing views and expectations of the next generation on society, government and business.

Young people today are coming to age in a world beset by crises. Even before the COVID-19 pandemic devastated lives and livelihoods around the world, the socio-economic systems of the past had put the liveability of the planet at risk and eroded the pathway to healthy, happy and fulfilled lives for too many.

Young people are right to be deeply concerned, seeing these challenges as a betrayal of our future. But we can't let these crises stifle us. We must remain optimistic – and we must act. That's why we launched the Davos Lab Initiative, to help inform and shape a more equitable future in the post-pandemic era.

As part of the initiative, Global Shapers facilitated dialogues and surveys in 150 cities. These dialogues engaged more than 2 million people and resulted in a **Youth Recovery Plan** featuring 40 policy recommendations to end intergenerational inequity.

The plan calls for stricter environmental policies, financial safeguards, increased access to technology and investment in programmes to support more young people to enter politics.

"Prior to COVID-19, an intergenerational crisis was already under way. Past generations created a socio-economic system that disproportionately rewards the happy few, underfunds social security and infrastructure, and puts the liability of the planet at risk – and the pandemic has only exacerbated this. 2021 must be the year that we start thinking and acting long-term again and make intergenerational parity the norm," said Klaus Schwab.

To turn these recommendations into realities, dialogues on what youth activism could look like were also run by participants. They created principles to guide their actions and activism for a more inclusive post-pandemic future. The culmination of these dialogues was presented in the Millennial Manifesto.


The Millennial Manifesto is the world's first attempt at redefining the efficacy of youth activism in a post-COVID-19 world marked by greater examples of systemic inequalities. "As uprooting systemic problems are particularly difficult for young people wrestling with challenges related to experience and credibility, this Millennial Manifesto acts as a guide providing timeless principles to sharpen their activism," Wadia Ait Hamza explained.

In January 2020, the Global Shapers Community, the Forum of Young Global Leaders and Accenture published a research paper titled 'Seeking Responsible Leadership' which identified five elements at the heart of responsible leadership, including:

Stakeholder Inclusion: Safeguarding trust and positive impact for all by standing in the shoes of stakeholders when making decisions, and fostering an inclusive environment where diverse individuals have a voice and feel they belong.

Emotion and Intuition: Unlocking commitment and creativity by showing compassion, humility and openness.

Mission and Purpose: Advancing common goals by inspiring a shared vision for our collective future.

Technology and Innovation: Creating new societal value by innovating responsibly with emerging technology.

Intellect and Insight: Finding new paths to success by embracing continuous learning and knowledge exchange.

In 2020-2021, the virtual environment provided an opportunity to develop unique programming to reinforce the five elements. The Responsible Leadership Accelerator was launched to provide community members with the resources they need to scale impactful initiatives while practicing responsible leadership.

Detroit Hub, Oslo Hub, Malmo Hub and Aguascalientes Hub were selected for a three-month accelerator programme, which included an intensive two-week virtual incubator to develop and refine their initiatives with a team of experts from Accenture.

The incubator was followed by two months of regular coaching to test and iterate their ideas. The theme of this accelerator round was social inclusion, with projects focused on empowering minority leadership, mobilizing citizen voting and safeguarding women's sexual health.

This year's programme also included a Responsible Leadership Challenge, a five-week virtual behaviour change experience. Over 700 Global Shapers and Young Global Leaders engaged in daily interactive challenges to expand their knowledge of responsible leadership, grow their networks through social learning, and implement behaviours of responsible leaders.

"I have to say the Responsible Leadership Challenge took a lot of soul searching. How do you define your purpose when you have never thought about it? My purpose, as a teacher, is to inspire future generations and help them transform their dreams into reality. My purpose, as a mother, is to love and nurture my children, so that they can grow up into well-rounded citizens," shared Jamila Fiargo, Global Shaper, Victoria Hub.

The challenge sparked conversations that extended beyond the portal, with participants sharing insights on social media, within their organisations and, even in one instance, developing a Responsible Leadership module for university students.

Over the coming year, our aim is to build a coalition of partner organizations to help broaden the Responsible Leadership Programme and ecosystem in collaboration with Accenture.

Amplifying the voices of youth

3,828 Global Shapers tuned into virtual sessions this year to share their insights and ideas on pressing global issues.

In 2020-2021, innovative online programming — including virtual trainings, community summits and a new Meet the Leader series, helped our members to grow their skills and extend their impact.

















In August 2020, 2,500 inspiring young leaders participated in the first-ever virtual Global Shapers Annual Summit to inspire, support and scale collective action. Members enrolled in a five-day programme featuring plenary sessions with leading experts including Al Gore, Ellyn Shook, Yo-Yo Ma and Lindiwe Mazibuko, along with community activities to build relationships and workshops to share best practices and plan projects.

In June 2021, 700 of our members participated in the virtual Annual Curators Meeting designed to equip hub leaders with the skills they need to lead positive change. The programme included workshops on building inclusive teams, establishing good governance and motivating others with guests such as Adam Grant, Manuel Wachter, Marisol Argueta de Barillas and Maya Roy.

Global Shapers also showcased youth-led solutions to global issues at virtual World Economic Forum meetings, including the Davos Agenda, Global Technology Governance Summit, Pioneers of Change Summit, Jobs Reset Summit and the Sustainable Development Impact Summit. Exposure at these events helped to extend the influence of our members and ensured that youth recommendations are heard and acted upon by world leaders.

Finally, members connected with experts through The Responsible Leadership Accelerator, The Climate Reality Leadership Training and a new virtual Meet the Leader series. In the later, Global Shapers advocated for greater transparency and trust between generations in conversations with Christine Lagarde, Jane Goodall, Peter Brabeck-Letmathe, Fabiola Gianotti and Mark Carney.

When people ask me: 'Who do you admire most?' I always answer Jane Goodall. To have the opportunity to actually connect with her face to face — what an amazing moment this was! Thank you to the Global Shapers Community for making this happen.




